- For those of you who may have moved recently, please check with the Town Clerk's office (508-862-4044) to make sure we have your current address on file, if not, you need to update your address with us, so you will be able to vote. If you have not registered to vote please do so now.
   Last day to register for the Tuesday, Sept. 9 State Primary is on Wednesday, August 20, 2014. The office will be open until 8:00 PM.
- If you have students in your family who are going off to college, make sure they stop by or you stop by and pick up an absentee ballot application so that they can vote absentee from college if they are not registering to vote at their college community.
- Not sure if you are registered to vote? Call us better to check now than find out you are not on the voting list.

### **REMINDER for DOG OWNERS...**

You need to have your dog licensed now. If you don't you will have to pay a \$5.00 late fee; but if you wait the late fee increases. So license your animal now. It is worth it – if your animal gets picked up by the dog officer or is reported for any reason and is unlicensed the **fine is \$50.00**...much higher than the cost of the license. You may license by mail – just send a copy of your current rabies certificate and a check for \$7.00 if the animal is spayed or neutered or \$10 if they are not (plus the \$5.00 late fee). Please include your email address so that we may remind you of the licensing period next spring.

### A Friendly Reminder from Animal Control:

Pursuant to the Town Manager's Dog Control Regulations, no person owning or having the care, custody or control of any dog shall allow said dog on any Town Beach or Recreation area from May 15 to September 15 without the written authorization of the Town Manager or official in control of said Beach or Recreation area.

#### An Update from the Assessing Department

The month of July brings heat and humidity to the Cape but it also begins the period to apply for all the types of exemptions for Fiscal Year 2015. The auglification date required by the elderly, blind and veterans exemptions is July 1 of the fiscal year, every year. Each exemption has its own specific requirements for gualification and the applications and gualification requirements are available on our assessor's website on the Town's Homepage, at the Department of Revenue website or at our front counter. The residential exemption has a different qualifying date of January 1 prior to the fiscal year being applied for. For example, to qualify for the FY2015 residential exemption, you must first own and occupy your property as of January 1, 2014 and then file the application on or after July 1, 2015. All exemptions received and gualified by the Board of Assessors by the end of October will be reflected on your actual tax bill, normally issued at the end of December. All of these exemptions also allow an applicant to still file for the exemption up to 3 months after the actual tax bill is issued. That means if the FY2015 tax bills are issued on December 31, 2014, you still have until March 31, 2015, or 3 months later, to apply for and receive an exemption for FY2015. The issue that causes the most problems with qualifying for any of these exemptions is missing documentation that supports the application. In the case of the elderly exemption it is usually incomplete income and asset information that requires our staff to contact the applicant to request the missing information and that delays qualification and sometimes causes denials. So, if applying, be sure to completely read the instructions, fill out the applications and supply copies of the required information prior to submitting it to this office. Also, the blind, elderly and veterans exemptions require a new application every fiscal year while the residential exemption only has to be done once or until the ownership status changes. If you fail to apply within the statutory times outlined above in any one year, the Board of Assessors has no authority to grant the exemption for that year, regardless of otherwise being qualified. If you have any questions when working with these applications, please call the Assessor's Office at 508-862-4022 and we'll be happy to answer them to ensure that you receive the exemption you're entitled to in a timely manner.

#### Street, Line Painting

One of the many activities that the Highway Division tackles in the summer is repainting the road lines on our streets. This work is done by a Contractor with DPW Employee supervision. It is generally accomplished in the mid to late summer, and will be done in August this year. It is usually accomplished overnight, between the hours of 11PM and 5AM, to avoid traffic and having cars driving through the freshly painted lines. The paint used is a chlorinated rubber paint, with glass beads mixed in for reflectivity. It usually takes about 20 minutes to dry, weather permitting, at which points cars can drive on it. The equipment used to apply the paint is a spray truck which holds approximately 500 gallons of paint, and 1,000 pounds of glass beads. The beads are added to the paint at a rate of 5 pounds per 320 linear feet of road line. We try to paint all of our main roads, both colors (yellow in the middle and white fog lines on the sides) every year. This is equal to repainting approximately 80 miles of road (both colors) a year. It generally takes about 8 nights to accomplish this.

We will be announcing via the web and channel 18 when we will be doing the painting. There will be a Police Detail with the crew, but we are asking folks to avoid the areas that are being painted and stay off the freshly painted lines until they are completely dry.

#### DPW's Work Order Systems

If you report an issue with roads, or buildings and grounds; it is converted into a work order. The way the system works is the person who took your call will document the issue and enter it as a work order. The appropriate Section Foreman (Roads, Forestry, Traffic Signs, Grounds, etc.) then gets the work order and assigns it to either be investigated, or addressed. Their crew then investigates/addresses the issue and, when done, closes out the work order. Generally speaking we will ask you for your name and a phone number in case the crew needs to contact you for more information about the issue. Last year the Highway Division received over 2,500 work orders, and the Structures and Grounds Division received almost 1,700 work orders. You can see we are very busy responding to identified issues in Town.

### Barnstable Municipal Airport Upgrades Underway

### A Note From the Town Collector:

The FY2015 Preliminary Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were issued and mailed on July 1, 2014. The following is the schedule for payments:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2015 Preliminary Tax Bills will be mailed by July 1, 2014

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2014
  - ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 3, 2014

### Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 31, 2014

- ✓ Third Quarter due February 2, 2015
- ✓ Fourth Quarter due May 1, 2015

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks getting processed in a timely manner. This service is only for the "open" period of the bill, which means that once the due date is reached, you should mail the payment to The Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 to avoid a delay.

If you use your own on-line bill payment process, would you kindly check and make sure that the proper address is used for the mailing address (Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601)? These on-line checks must be processed manually and sending them to the Lockbox delays the processing.

#### From the Weights and Measures Program Manager-Jane Zulkiewicz

Summer is here and the most common things many of us buy are picnic items to have at the beach, or bringing food to an event. Doing so involves keeping items cold, thus we purchase bags or blocks of ice. Rest assured the weights and measures staff is out there checking the net weight on these commodities. Net weights of a commodity are inspected to ensure that the tare is being taken so the gross weight is not being charged. The tare is the container or package which the product is packed and the customer should NOT be charged for the weight of the packaging. Last month inspectors checked 48 bags of ice at various locations and packed by various local ice companies, the results were impressive in that most labeled 5 lb bags were heavy by approximately .39 lb per bag. Calculated by the price of the 5 lb bag of ice times the lot cost error (price) and probable bags sold in a year, this estimated boost to your bag of ice could be a loss to the merchant in this particular sample approximately \$16,000 in a years time. We always leave our test results with the merchant we are inspecting.

Other items normally checked are pre-packed tuna and chicken salads, fruits and sides such as Cole slaw and potato/macaroni salads. Once again the seller cannot include and charge you for the weight of that plastic container.

For you trivia buffs, the word tare can be traced through history. It is derived from the Arabic word, tarha. Tarha literally means, "that which is removed."

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the performance of a commercial weighing or measuring device used for trade, bring it to the attention of the merchant. If the problem is not resolved, contact the local Weights & Measures office for advice and/or assistance. The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes; Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Chatham, Dennis, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.

### HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

- 1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
- 2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
- 3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
- 4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster PlanWhile Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.2. What is your evacuation route.3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.4. Whether or not you are located in an evacu- ation zone.5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.	<ul> <li><u>The Emergency Survival Kit</u> Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.</li> <li>Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)</li> <li>One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.</li> <li>A basic first aid kit.</li> <li>Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.</li> </ul>
<ol> <li>What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters <u>DO NOT</u> allow pets.</li> <li>Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.</li> <li>Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.</li> <li>Prepare your Survival Kit.</li> </ol>	<ul> <li><u>Remember</u>, in the event of a severe storm:</li> <li>Secure all outdoor objects.</li> <li>Stay away from windows.</li> <li>Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.</li> <li>Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.</li> <li>If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!</li> </ul>
