AUGUST UPDATES...FROM THE TOWN CLERK

Well summer is upon us and the fall election is just a few months away. Here are a few reminders so you will not have any surprises when you go to vote.



- ✓ For those of you who may have moved recently, please check with the Town Clerk's office (508-862-4044) to make sure we have your current address on file so that if need be, you may be updated and notified of your new voting precinct.
- ✓ If you have students in your family who are going off to college, make sure they stop by or you stop by and pick up an absentee ballot application so that they can vote absentee from college if they are not registering to vote in their college community.
- ✓ Not sure if you are registered to vote? Call us – better to check now than find out you are not on the voting list.

REMINDER for DOG OWNERS:

As of July 1, 2015, all dogs in the Town of Barnstable should be licensed for this year. (New license period ending June 30, 2016).

If you no longer own a dog, or your dog has passed away, please call, 508-862-4044 and give us your name and your dog's name and we will take you off of our list.

We need you to take action on this by licensing your dog now; you will be incurring a late fee on top of the licensing fee at the end of this month! Also, we will be sending the list of unlicensed dogs to the Animal Control Officer, which could result in other fines.

Again, please send your **updated rabies certificate, a check made out to the Town of Barnstable, a self-addressed stamped envelope and include your email address**, so we may notify you via email of the dog licensing period each year.

Thank you for your cooperation by showing us that you are a responsible dog owner.

RON PERSUITTE RE-ELECTED TO FOURTH TERM AS CHAIRMAN OF BARNSTABLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT COMMISSION John Griffin, Robert O'Brien Re-elected as well



Ronald Persuitte of Barnstable Village has been re-elected unanimously to a fourth term as chairman of the Barnstable Municipal Airport Commission.

At the commission's June 23rd meeting, John Griffin also was unanimously elected to a second term as vice chairman, and Robert O'Brien was chosen unanimously for another term as clerk of the commission.

Persuitte has been a member since 2007 and previously served as head of the commission's finance subcommittee. He owns an investment planning and counseling service in Hyannis.

Griffin, who lives in Centerville, has served on the airport commission since 1998. He currently heads the commission's Infrastructure and Marketing Subcommittee. He is a licensed private pilot. In addition, Airport Manager Roland "Bud" Breault was given a three-year extension to his current contract.

Our three-day summer leadership team workshop will take place from August 18 to 20. This is an opportunity for all leaders to discuss the priorities for the 2015-2016 school year, including in particular continued work on the district's multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS) initiative. MTSS provides a framework for school improvement focused on system level change across the classroom, school, and district to meet the academic and non-academic needs of all students, including students with disabilities, English language learners, and students who are academically advanced. This workshop will help to set the tone for the coming school year and develop team building skills that will promote district-wide and school-wide collaboration and communication. We look forward to a productive time together.

We also look forward to the completion and opening of the new Enoch Cobb Early Learning Center located adjacent to Hyannis West Elementary School. This modular building will house the district's integrated preschool program and will provide the program with a state-of-the-art facility designed to meet the special needs of the children.

News You Can Use

A note from the Town Collector's office:

We hope you are having a safe, happy, and healthy summer!

The FY2016 Preliminary Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were issued and mailed on July 1, 2015. The following is the schedule for payments:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2016

Preliminary Tax Bills will be mailed by July 1, 2015

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 3, 2015
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 2, 2015

Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 31, 2015

- ✓ Third Quarter due February 1, 2016
- ✓ Fourth Quarter due May 2, 2016

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks getting processed in a timely manner. This service is only for the "open" period of the bill, which means that once the due date is reached, you should mail the payment to The Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601 to avoid a delay.

If you use your own on-line bill payment process, please kindly check and make sure that the proper address is used for the mailing address (Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601). These on-line checks must be processed manually and sending them to the Lockbox delays the processing.

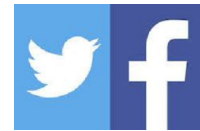

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What is your evacuation route.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters **DO NOT** allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!

Kennedy Legacy Walking Trail

The Kennedy Legacy walking trail guides visitors to 10 important Kennedy family sites in downtown Hyannis. At each site, an informational sign uncovers stories and history about the Kennedy's on Cape Cod. Sites include the Hyannis Armory, where presidential candidate John F. Kennedy gave his acceptance speech, and the Kennedy's church, St Francis Xavier, where Rose Kennedy and other family members attended mass. Take the walking tour to gain an understanding of the Kennedy family's ties to Cape Cod.

The walking trail is 1.6 miles in one direction, and takes approximately 1 hour to complete. An additional 30 minutes should be allotted to walk back to the beginning of the trail. During the peak summer season, a free trolley can be taken to make the return trip.
