At the June 4th Town Council meeting, Finance Director Mark Milne and I will deliver the FY 2016 Budget Message to the Councilors with the theme of "Meeting the Needs of Our Citizens". There have been several bills mailed out over the last few months, so now is an excellent time to check and make sure that you are current with your real estate, personal property, motor vehicle excise, boat excise and sewer rental bills. We are more than happy to check the status of these bills for you if you call our office at 508-862-4054.

The new fiscal year will soon be upon us, which means your real estate and personal property tax bills will be mailed for FY2016. The Preliminary schedule will be:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2016

Preliminary Tax Bills will be mailed by July 1, 2015

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 3, 2015
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 2, 2015

Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 31, 2015

- ✓ Third Quarter **due** February 1, 2016
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due** May 2, 2016

2015 PARKING PERMITS/BEACH STICKERS

All 2015 Parking Permits/Beach stickers are available for purchase seven days a week at the Hyannis Youth and Community Center located at 141 Bassett Lane, Hyannis, MA 508-790-6345.

Hours of operation:

Monday through Saturday ~ 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

Sundays and Holidays ~ 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.



Types of permits and fees:

Resident: \$35 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches. Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Resident parking permits are required annually beginning January 1st through December 31st.

Landlord: \$275 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches. Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Seasonal: \$200 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to public beaches only. A list of all public beaches is available upon purchase of this permit.

Weekly: \$50 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into public beaches only. A list of all public beaches is available upon purchase of this permit.

Parking Permits (Beach Stickers) applications will be emailed to all those who provided an e-mail address last year. This is a convenient way for residents to obtain their permits. We ask that you complete and mail your permit application with all of the required documentation to us at 141 Bassett Lane, Hyannis, MA 02601. If you choose, prior to May 4, 2015, you may drop off the application and required documentation at the Hyannis Youth & Community Center with payment and a self-addressed stamped envelope. The application will be processed and the permit will be mailed back to you. The turn around time is approximately three to four weeks.

- * Natural Resources staff and town shellfish volunteers will be available to assist any young digger who wants the help.
- * Be prepared to get wet! The shellfish live in wet sand that gets covered by saltwater when the tide is high. Waders, hip boots or knee boots would be helpful. Protective gloves are necessary.
- * Shellfish may be taken by hand or rake. Small (garden) hand rakes and trowels will be allowed for the young diggers.
- * Attendees will receive a free "Clammer Kid" badge and an activity booklet.
- * Shellfish that are legally harvested may be taken home.
- * Certificates of Completion for this Clamming Class for Kids will be handed out as you leave with your catch.

NEW STATE STUDY SAYS AIRPORT PUMPS \$208 MILLION INTO CAPE COD ECONOMY EACH YEAR

What is Barnstable Municipal Airport worth to the Cape Cod economy? The Aeronautics Division of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation has an answer. In an update of its 2011 airport impact study, the agency estimates the total economic value of the Hyannis-based airport to be about \$208 million annually. The figure includes \$119.2 million in direct effects and \$88.7 million in airport business and employee payroll that are recirculated into the community. For every \$100 spent by aviation-related businesses, an additional multiplier of \$56 is created in the local economy.

Barnstable Airport is the primary aviation gateway for tourism in the region, and for private aircraft and air cargo, the study concluded. It is crucial to the regional economy for the transport of workers, food, and time-sensitive cargo to Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard as well.

Barnstable Airport completed \$40 million worth of major capital improvements in 2011 and has finished a number of additional airfield upgrades since then; more are underway. For more on the study and the upgrades, please visit www.town.barnstable.ma.us/airport.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What is your evacuation route.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters **DO NOT** allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!
