Please include your email address so that we may send out a reminder notice to you next year. You may also renew in person during regular office hours from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM Monday through Friday.

Superintendent's Corner

As I write this in mid-May, we have just experienced the five darkest days in May ever (not a single minute of sunshine), followed by five days of gorgeous sunshine. Welcome to spring on Cape Cod.

June is perhaps the busiest month of the year in our schools, filled with celebrations, concerts, field trips, events, and graduation. We reflect on the school year ending and look forward to summer vacation. Our graduating seniors look forward to college or other new beginnings.

I have attended or will be attending various school events, including the National Honor Society Induction Ceremony, SEPAC's Wind Beneath My Wings Ceremony and Reception, the Barnstable Public Schools (BPS) Staff Retirement Dinner, and the Special Education Graduation. The BHS graduation will take place on Saturday, June 4, at 2:00 p.m. The last day of school for all Barnstable Public Schools is a half day on June 20.

This is my final contribution to the Barnstable Bulletin as Interim Superintendent of the Barnstable Public Schools. Meg Mayo-Brown, currently superintendent in Fall River, will begin her service as Superintendent in Barnstable on July 1. I look forward to working with her and supporting her and the School Committee next year in my role as Assistant Superintendent and Legal Counsel.

Our accomplishments this year include:

- Opening the Enoch Cobb Early Learning Center housing our integrated preschool program;
- Completing our second year of work with the National Center for Learning Disabilities to implement a framework of multi-tiered system of supports to meet the needs of all students, including student-centered schedules in the K-7 grades that include expanded blocks of instruction in ELA and Math;
- Removing all portable classrooms throughout the district; and
- Completing a successful search for a new superintendent.

I was honored to be asked by the School Committee to serve as Interim Superintendent during this transition year between Mary Czajkowski and Meg Mayo-Brown. I am deeply grateful for the support I have received from the School Committee, administration, staff, and school community.

As we look forward to new leadership next year, I wish everyone a happy and safe summer.

There have been several bills mailed out over the last few months, so now is an excellent time to check and make sure that you are current with your real estate, personal property, motor vehicle excise, boat excise and sewer rental bills. We are more than happy to check the status of these bills for you if you call our office at 508-862-4054.

The new fiscal year will soon be upon us, which means your real estate and personal property tax bills will be mailed for FY2017. The Preliminary schedule will be:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2017

Preliminary Tax Bills will be mailed by July 1, 2016

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2016
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 1, 2016

Actual Tax Bills will be mailed by December 30, 2016

- ✓ Third Quarter **due** February 1, 2017
- ✓ Fourth Quarter **due** May 1, 2017

Centerville Pie Café Lands at Barnstable Airport

The Centerville Pie Café celebrated its official opening on May 12, 2016 at Barnstable Municipal Airport. Local business leaders, dignitaries, airport travelers and residents were on hand for the celebration, which included a "pie cutting" ceremony in lieu of the traditional ribbon cutting.

This is the second restaurant location for the Centerville Pie Company, which also operates a restaurant and bakery at its flagship location in Centerville. Located in the main terminal, the new café will offer breakfast and lunch daily. The parking lot features free parking for restaurant patrons, several reserved spots designated with "Pie-ority Parking" signs, and convenient curbside takeout.

The grand opening coincided with the return of JetBlue service between New York and Hyannis for the third season. Passengers aboard the inaugural flight were greeted with complimentary pie bites.

The Centerville Pie Café menu will offer the company's famous savory and sweet pies, along with soups, salads, sandwiches, and dessert items. Frozen dinner pies and full size sweet pies are also available for those who want to savor their sweets at home. The restaurant will be open daily from 6 am – 2 pm. 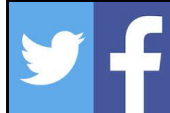

The Barnstable Harbormaster Pumpout Boats are in service for the boating season beginning Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend. As the boating season is underway, the pumpout boats will be running seven days a week. The boats can be easily identified. Both boats are white center console vessels with the lettering "HARBORMASTER" on both sides.

The pumpout boats monitor VHF channels 16 and 09 during operating hours. 2016 Parking Permits/Beach Stickers Walk-In Purchases

Barnstable Recreation is pleased to announce that 2016 Parking Permits are available to purchase in person at the Hyannis Youth and Community Center, 141 Bassett Lane, Hyannis, MA 02601.



Hours of Operation:

Monday through Saturday – 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Sundays and Holidays – 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Required documents:

A copy of the current registration for each vehicle requesting a permit.

A. If your registration(s) does not reflect a Barnstable address and you are a Barnstable taxpayer, we have the software available to research and confirm taxpayer status.

B. If your registration(s) reflects a leased vehicle, please bring in a copy of each registration and a copy of the page from your lease agreement showing your name on the agreement.

C. If your vehicle is leased or registered to the business you own or work for, please bring in a copy of each registration and a copy of the lease agreement as well as any document that links you to the business (business card, letterhead, etc.)

Types of permits and fees:

Resident: \$40 offered to year-round residents and/or taxpayers. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and resident). Valid vehicle registration and taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Landlord: \$300 offered to taxpayers who rent their property during the summer season. This permit allows entry to all beaches (public and resident). Taxpayer status is required to purchase this permit.

Seasonal: \$250 offered to summer residents. This permit allows entry to **public beaches only**.

Weekly: \$70 per week (seven consecutive days). This permit allows entry into **public beaches only**.

Replacement: \$5. This permit is offered at a reduced rate should you sell your vehicle or install a new windshield **after** purchasing your initial permit. You must present your original permit to receive the reduced rate.

Handicap: \$15 per permit (limit of two per household). Available to resident and/or taxpayer handicap individuals who have a valid driver's license and own a vehicle registered in their name.
