As school starts we wish all of our students, teachers and staff a great start to the new school year.



SEPTEMBER...ELECTION NEWS



The State Primary Election is Tuesday, September 9, 2014. The following offices are on the ballots: Senator in Congress; Governor; Lieutenant Governor; Attorney General; Secretary of State; Treasurer; Auditor; Representative in Congress; Councilor; Senator in General Court; Representative in General Court (depending on which precinct you vote in); District Attorney; Register of Probate and County Commissioner.

A primary election is a nominating election. In the Town of Barnstable residents who vote in the primary election vote either the Democratic Party ballot; or the Republican Party ballot. If you are a registered Republican that is the only ballot you will be able to receive. If you are a registered Democrat you will be given that ballot. If you are registered as Unenrolled, you may choose any of the ballots available. However, if you are registered in a political designation, such as Interdependent Third Party, or Green Rainbow, you cannot vote in the Primary Election.

Winning the party's nomination is the first step in the election process. This step narrows the field down to one political party candidate from each party for the one specific office. The next step is the State Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014; we hope to see all registered voters participate in this election.

It is an exciting time of year as we welcome students and staff to the 2014-2015 school year! With over 5,100 students and more than 350 instructional staff, Barnstable is the largest K-12 school system on Cape Cod. Our theme this school year is **"Teaching, Leading and Learning: What Matters Most."**

As we prepare for the new school year, I would like to share some of our district goals:

- ⇒ Improve the teaching and learning environment for our integrated pre-school programs for all students and staff through the construction of a new Early Learning Center with an occupancy date of February, 2015.
- ⇒ Develop a cohesive, coherent approach to systemic tiered support of interventions that include academic, behavioral and emotional/social needs of our students.
- ⇒ Continued communication and collaboration with the Special Education Parent Advisory Council. Develop a program for training of paraprofessionals around inclusive classrooms.
- ⇒ Begin preparation for a new statewide assessment system.
- ⇒ Continue to recruit, train and support our new teachers and administrators.
- ⇒ Continue our work with the new educator evaluation system and begin to identify district determined measures for our teachers and administrators as a part of this new evaluation system.

What is constant, yet ever new and changing? The answer to that conundrum is the teaching profession. From blackboards to iPads, technology has impacted the ways in which teachers teach and students learn. Yet, the three "R's" are still as important today as they were at the turn of the last century. We look forward to a new school year filled with the three "R's" and the importance of teaching all students so that they may achieve their full potential.



Town of Barnstable Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The Town of Barnstable Growth Management Department encourages residents and other interested parties to review the Draft Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Review (CAPER), year end report that outlines Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) expenditures and accomplishments funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Town received \$296,843 in CDBG funds plus \$17,503 in program income to carry out the goals and objectives of the Action Plan.

New Solid Waste Contract

Since the capping of the Landfill in Marstons Mills years ago, the Town has sent its trash to the SEMASS facility in Rochester for disposal via incineration ("waste to energy"). That contract is now nearing its end, and as a result the DPW has been negotiating with two companies that were competing for the next contract. One was Covanta, who operates the SEMASS waste to energy facility in Rochester, MA. The other was New Bedford Waste Services, which is in the process of building a state of the art facility to create fuel briquettes from trash that will be used in industry. The goal in these negotiations was to get the best deal possible for the Town, and we are pleased to announce that we feel we achieved that. In August the Town Manager signed a contract with New Bedford Waste Services for our solid waste disposal and recycling transportation related services. The contract had previously been unanimously accepted by the Town Council.

Currently the Town pays \$37.50/ton of trash. Surrounding communities that have already signed new deals are generally paying between \$60-\$75/ton, not including transportation costs. We were able to secure a contract that will cost \$55/ton for MSW disposal and \$12/ton for transportation. This contract imposes no minimum or maximum ton limits upon the Town; takes recyclables for free; but allows the Town to market its recyclables outside of the contract if it so chooses. Currently this is the most cost competitive contract on the Cape.

In addition to being the best value, we are excited that the new process that New Bedford Waste Services will be using to dispose of our trash will ensure that between 90 and 95% of all waste sent to that facility is either recycled, or reused as fuel briquettes. These briquettes, called EcoTac, are a coal solid fuel alternative that provides a comparable to coal high BTU fuel value; all while reducing emissions of sulfur, carbon dioxide, mercury and many other pollutants into the atmosphere. A true win-win!

Even with this new contract, trash disposal is expensive. The best way to help keep the cost of solid waste disposal down is to recycle (effectively \$67/ton for MSW disposal, \$0/ton for recyclables). There is a long list of what can be recycled at the Solid Waste Facility on our website, which I am encouraging you to review.

THE WINGS OF FREEDOM TOUR RETURNS TO HYANNIS SEPTEMBER 17-19

Vintage Aircraft that helped win World War II Open for Tours

Three mighty "war birds" that helped America fight the Second World War will make a return visit to Barnstable Airport next month.

Two heavy bombers—a B-24J Liberator and a B-17 Flying Fortress—are scheduled to land at the airport between 1:30 and 2 p.m., Wednesday, September 17, accompanied by a P-51 Mustang fighter. The three aircraft will park on the airport's east ramp, near Route 28 and Mary Dunn Way. Public admission will be exclusively through the airport gate on Mary Dunn Way. There will be free parking.

The restored aircraft will be open for tours from 2-5 p.m. that day, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday, September 18, and 9 a.m. to noon Friday, September 19. Adult visitors may explore the aircraft—inside and out—for \$12; children 12 and younger will be charged \$6 dollars. Discounts are available for school groups. World War II veterans are invited to tour the aircraft at no charge. Funds go to the non-profit Collings Foundation of Stow, Mass. which keeps the aircraft flying.

Thirty-minute flights aboard the heavy bombers may be scheduled for \$450 per person. Flights in the P-51C Mustang begin at \$2,200 for a half hour.

"During this 70th anniversary year of D-Day, the Allies' invasion to liberate Europe during World War II, it is of special significance that the "war birds" return to Hyannis," said Airport Manager Roland "Bud" Breault. "The bombers were the backbone of the American war effort and were renowned for efficiently destroying enemy war-making facilities at key points during the war." The B-24J Liberator and the P-51C full dual control Mustang are the only examples of their types still flying, according to the Collings Foundation.

The Wings of Freedom Tour visits an average of 120 cities in 35 states each year.

Catch the **COASTSWEEP** wave. Join the **Town of Barnstable** beach cleanup!

While the summertime beach season is winding down, Barnstable is gearing up for **COASTSWEEP 2014** at local beaches. Cleanups will take place on Saturday, **September 20th** with a rain date of Sunday, **September 21st**. Other cleanups will take place at various locations throughout September.

Sponsored by the Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone Management, thousands of COASTSWEEP volunteers remove debris that would otherwise pollute our oceans, beaches, lakes, and rivers. Participants collect bag after bag of trash and debris, and record their findings onto data cards. The data is sent to the Ocean Conservancy and entered into a massive marine debris database. This information is then analyzed and used to identify the sources of marine debris, which helps to prevent the problem in the future.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What is your evacuation route.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters **DO NOT** allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!


