In closing, I wish you and your family a joyous and safe Holiday Season! Regards,



Superintendent's Corner

The Spirit of Giving this Holiday Season

The holiday season always seems to bring out our spirit of giving. We give presents to our family and friends, as well as our time and money to various charitable organizations. Barnstable High School students are involved in many different charitable events: sponsoring fundraisers, collecting items for less fortunate individuals, and many other positive community events. The holiday season brings out their spirit of giving in the many fundraising events they sponsor. There are blood drives for Cape Cod Hospital, food drives for Thanksgiving and Christmas, various clothing drives, a Make Your Own Gingerbread House fundraiser, free skate nights, and Toys for Tots Stuff The Bus to name a few. These fundraising events are organized by many different athletic teams and student groups to benefit numerous organizations in our community.

Recently, during the inaugural taping of Superintendent's Corner airing on B2B Ch. 18, I had the great fortune to sit down with two BHS Seniors, Olivia Brodt and Donnie Brodd. Olivia and Donnie are the Student Envoys to the School Committee, student-athletes, and participants in various charitable events. We spoke about the charitable events they are involved in, what participating in these events means to the BHS students, and why they feel it's important to be involved. Last year the BHS community, through their many charitable fundraising events, donated 895 toys. This year their goal is to donate 1,000 toys. Donnie's BHS Hockey Team hosts a "Skate with the Raiders Night" where kids have the opportunity to skate with the BHS Boys Hockey Team with a donation of a toy. The team was able to donate 150 toys to the Toys for Tots Stuff a Bus event. The BHS Girls' Hockey Team also hosts a "Skate with the Raiders Night." Olivia feels BHS students want to be involved in these charitable events because they "see their little contribution, even just one toy and they know they are contributing to the bigger picture and making a difference." This month we have two important issues to discuss: Snow and Ice and pending changes at the Solid Waste Facility.

Snow and Ice

Last month we started talking about Snow and Ice procedures, and the importance of lawn staking to help prevent plow damage. This month we discuss our approach to a snow and ice event.

The DPW is responsible for snow and ice removal from 461 miles of roads (approximately 271 miles of public and 190 miles of private roads – it is worth noting that, by road miles, Barnstable is the 4th largest community in the State). In addition we clear 54 municipal parking lots, approximately 90 miles of town sidewalks, and 4 miles of bike paths. To do this we use our own employees and 65 Town vehicles along with approximately 100 contractors (many of whom have multiple employees engaged for us during a storm) and approximately 165 pieces of their equipment. All told, during a plowable event there are almost 250 people involved in the operation.

During a storm it is generally not possible for the Department to achieve and maintain bare pavement. Instead we are trying to achieve a condition where sufficient snow is cleared to allow the public to travel at reduced speeds throughout the town. In some circumstances, this may not even be possible until after the snowfall has ended.

For the larger events, we will approach the storm in four phases:

- Anti-Icing Operations prior to the storm the DPW will pretreat main roads and select secondary roads with salt or a salt mixture. This material will create a brine layer and prevent the initial snow from bonding to the roads. Salt may also be applied during the storm to maintain this brine layer. Were the event strictly an icing event without significant snowfall, this would be all that occurs.
- **Plowing Operations** during significant snowfalls, plowing is intended to remove the accumulated snow and keep the roads passable. At the end of the storm the plows will begin to push back the amassed snow to the edge of the pavement.
- **De-icing Operations** after the storm, once the bulk of the snow has been removed/pushed back by plowing, salt may again be applied to help melt any residual snow pack that did stick to the pavement.
- Clean-up Operations after the first three phases have been completed, sidewalk plowing begins, with emphasis on village centers and the sidewalks adjacent to and radiating from public schools. Also during this phase, if the Town Manager determines that the excess snow in the Village Centers needs to be removed, the DPW will come in and truck it away, generally at night.

It should be noted that in the case of severe storms, the conditions may dictate that DPW modifies its goals to just keeping major thoroughfares open for emergency vehicles. In long duration storms, or very intense conditions, it is possible that the DPW may have to temporarily cease plowing operations to either rest crews, due to low visibility, or because snow removal operations have temporarily become futile.

For any plowable event the DPW strives to make sure the public is aware of what is going on. To do this we use radio, and commercial and local access TV interviews and notices. We also add a storm banner to the top of the Town's web site. This banner is updated by DPW personnel throughout the event to provide information on the storm, and efforts to clean it up.

As you can see, snow and ice operations are big events, with many moving parts. We are very proud of our staff and how they handle these, but are always looking for ways to make it better and safer for the residents. Please let us know (508-790-6330) if you have any ideas, or want to discuss snow and ice issues. Again, if you could help us by staking lawns and making sure all obstacles are out of the roadway, it would be greatly appreciated by our crews.

Solid Waste Facility - Two Important Changes

In an effort to better serve Barnstable residents and make recycling more convenient, two important changes will be taking place at the Solid Waste Facility. The first is the facility will convert to "single stream" recycling. Beginning in the New Year, transfer station customers who recycle will no longer have to sort their plastic, aluminum cans, paper and bottles into separate containers. Instead, all recyclables (with the exception of corrugated cardboard which will still be separated) may now be combined together for disposal.

The second major change is that as of January 1, 2015 residents who use the Barnstable Transfer Station for the purpose of recycling-only will be required to have a Recycle Only sticker affixed to their front windshield. The sticker will only be available to Barnstable residents, is free of charge, and available at the facility office. This change will not affect those that buy a traditional sticker for the disposal of household waste and recycling. All transfer station rules and regulations apply to both stickers, and are available at the Transfer Station office or through the mail.

A Note From the Town Collector

If you use a checking/savings account, the charge is 40 cents and if you use a debit/credit card, the fee is a percentage based fee of 2.95% of the amount being paid. Background

The Barnstable Town Council has accepted Massachusetts Law, Chapter 60, Section 3D which allows the Town to establish a fund to defray the real estate taxes of low income elderly and disabled persons. Taxpayers contribute to the fund through a voluntary check- off on their real estate tax bills. A new application must be completed each year to qualify for the annual award.

Eligibility

• 65 years or older on July 01, 2014

OR

• **Disabled-** State recognized disability, applicant may be receiving benefits from one or more of the programs listed below based on a determination of disability:

SSI or Medicaid

Worker's Compensation

Employment and Vocational Rehabilitation

Mental Health Programs/Public Health Services

Other- as committee deems eligible

- Total gross household income shall not exceed \$30,000.00 (from all sources in the calendar year preceding the year in which application is made).
- Other Assets must be less than \$40,000. Other assets are the value of personal property
 and other real estate excluding domicile. This includes second homes, cars, boats, stocks,
 bonds, CD's, IRA's, savings and checking accounts, pension and annuity funds and any
 other tangible liquid assets.
- Applicant(s) must be the titled owner of the property or hold a life estate in the property on July 01, 2014. The property must be a primary residence.

Town of Barnstable Receives Budget Presentation Award

The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) is pleased to announce that **Town of Barnstable**, **Massachusetts** has received the GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for its budget.

The award represents a significant achievement by the entity. It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the entity had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as:

Budget

- a policy document
- a financial plan
- an operations guide
- a communications device

Budget documents must be rated "proficient" in all four categories, and the fourteen mandatory criteria within those categories, to receive the award.

When a Distinguished Budget Presentation Award is granted to an entity, a Certificate of Recognition for Budget Presentation is also presented to the individual or department designated as being primarily responsible for its having achieved the award. This has been presented to **Thomas K. Lynch, Town Manager**.

For budgets beginning in 2013, 1,424 participants received the Award. Award recipients have pioneered efforts to improve the quality of budgeting and provide an excellent example for other governments throughout North America.


