Happy New Year to all of you from all of us at the Town Clerk's office. Hope you and yours had a wonderful New Year's and may this year bring you good health and much happiness. We begin the New Year with the major project of our Census/Voter Registration forms going out to each household. One question that is asked many times is why do I and my husband receive separate census forms? If you have different last names, we have no idea if you are related, or reside in a separate apartment. All you need to do is to put a note on one of the forms and send both of them back together and tell us to combine the families and we will be happy to do it.

Also if you have someone who has moved out of your household and is a voter – please give us their address, email or phone number so that we may contact them and get verification. We cannot remove a voter without their verification; and thus many people stay on the census for 4 years until we can, by law, remove them. If anyone has been added to your household, just put their information down on one of the blank lines. Make any and all corrections on the form.

You cannot register to vote on the census form. You need to pick up a voter registration form at your local library and fill it out and send it in – or come in to the Clerk's office.

I wish to take a brief moment to congratulate my Assistant Ann Quirk, who was just elected to serve as Vice Chairman of the New England Municipal Clerks' Institute & Academy. She was sworn in recently at the New England Municipal City and Town Clerks' Association Conference in Providence, RI. Ann, who is a Certified Clerk, has been serving on the NEMCI Board of Directors.

Inside Barnstable Town Government Winter Classes

A Note From the Town Collector's Office:

Happy 2013! We hope it is a happy, healthy and prosperous year for all.

The FY2013 Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were mailed December 31, 2012. The three part billing has the remittance coupon for February 1st and the remittance coupon for May 1st and a Taxpayer's copy.

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2013

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2012

- ✓ First Quarter **due** August 1, 2012
- ✓ Second Quarter **due** November 1, 2012

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2012

- √ Third Quarter due February 1, 2013
- ✓ Fourth Quarter due May 1, 2013

Please check this bill very carefully as this is the Actual tax bill that reflects any change in the tax rates, assessment, betterment/lien and exemptions. If you have any questions regarding the assessment of the property, you should contact the Assessor's office at 508-862-4022 immediately.

A few tips: If you use your own online bill payment system, please take a moment to make sure you have the correct information in the system. Check should be made payable to: Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 40, Hyannis, MA 02601-0040 and NOT the Lockbox Service, which is the address on the return envelope enclosed with your bill. The Lockbox Service processes the payments electronically for us and without an encoded payment coupon, your own online check can not be processed this way. Your check needs to be processed manually. You should always use the parcel id# as the identifying account number for real estate as this number does not change each year. If the check is addressed to the Lockbox, it is rejected and mailed back to our office, which causes a delay in the posting of your payment and make your payment late.

Check the Town website at: www.town.barnstable.ma.us to explore the option of scheduling your payment online. If you pay with a checking/savings account, the fee is 40 cents. If you use a debit/credit card, there is a percentage based fee of 2.95% of the amount being paid. These fees are not collected by the Town of Barnstable. If you need any assistance with registering to use the online bill payment system, please feel free to contact my office at 508-862-4054.

An Assessing Department Notice:

The FY2013 actual tax bills were mailed December 31, 2012. The filing period for abatement requests runs from Jan. 2 thru Feb.1, 2013 at 4:30 P.M., no exceptions. The FY2013 valuations are based upon sales that occurred in the calendar years of 2010 and 2011 and abatement requests based on market must be supported by valid sales of similar properties from those two years only. Foreclosure, bank & short sales ARE NOT valid market sales and will not be considered as comparables for abatement requests by the Board of Assessors. Sales that occurred during 2012 will be used to establish the FY2014 values. The Board of Assessors will have 90 days from the date an abatement is filed to make a decision. Also, if you are qualified to receive an exemption of any type but haven't filed yet, you still have 90 days from December 31, 2012 to file for the exemption for FY13. The five Fire Districts of the Town of Barnstable offer the following information: Ice and Cold Water Safety

Many citizens are injured each year by exposure to cold weather and cold water. Fishermen and skaters fall through the ice and boaters often end up capsizing their boats and canoes. It is important to wear life preservers when boating especially during the months between October and May.

Just to restate: there is no such thing as safe ice. Rivers, streams and brooks pose a danger as the ice never freezes thick enough to support weight. No one should declare that any ice is safe!



Actually, the best ice around will be found at the <u>Hyannis Youth & Community Center</u>.



What should I do if someone falls through the ice?

- Act fast! Call 9-1-1 for help immediately. Alert rescue personnel to respond.
- DO NOT go out onto the ice! Don't become a second victim.
- **Reach, Throw or Row.** Extend a branch or pole to the victim. Throw a life ring or a rope to the victim. If a boat is available, push or row it to the victim.




What is cold water?

It is any water that is colder than your normal body temperature of 98.6 degrees.

Cold water can drain away your body heat almost 25 to 30 times faster than air.

Cold water can cause hypothermia which is an excessive lowering of body temperature.





Dress for the weather, and yes, wear a hat or keep your head covered to prevent losing half of your body heat through your head.
