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

Dear Appointments Committee,
Thank you for considering this application to join the Hyannis Main Street Waterfront Historic District Appeals Committee. As I am one of a few souls to file an appeal before this committee, thought I should share my expertise and contribute to the long-term success of Main Street's revitalization by applying to fill the current vacancy on the Appeals Committee. I love historic structures and appreciate the importance of preserving them for future generations. I also respect the challenges businesses face operating profitably in a highly regulated environment. Historic concerns about "character" can confound property owners and understandably lead to appeals.
My father had a love of old trains, and I spent many a weekend in his garage cutting, sanding, painting and assembling his model train landscapes as a boy. I put those skills to good use in college where I spent my summer months restoring 1880-1890 Victorians in the historic
Willamette River Valley in Portland, Oregon. My specialty was windows and trim and I enjoyed a reputation as a first-rate restoration specialist. My first home was a 1908 Victorian on the Main
Street of a small community outside of Dallas and when I returned to Boston, I purchased a condo in a 1925 building where I actively participate in renovation projects. I currently reside in 1973 Cape ranch off Craigville Beach Road.
My wife and I purchased our home in Hyannis after several years of vacationing on the Cape. Or Sundays, we often found ourselves strolling along Main Street and decided to make it our home We've observed the push and pull of development in this area, and I've researched and published numerous articles on the history of Hyannis Main Street. I have a particular interest in preserving and restoring the old Hyannis Trust Company building as a Welcome Center for future guests to our community.
As part of my preparations for the appeal of the Certificate of Appropriateness to demolish the old Hyannis Trust Company building, I prepared and presented a 30-page design brief on Main Street design guidelines. (See attached). Our guidelines for the historic District have changed over the years to allow more flexibility for business owners, property owners, and builders. This flexibility has opened the door to profiteering and very public misunderstandings as to the intent of the guidelines. My approach to these competing viewpoints is literal, but not strictly constructionist. In my opinion new construction should bear some resemblance to the guidelines as written.
I believe that for businesses to prosper on Main Street, the community needs to offer them our full support. And for Main Street to succeed as a destination on the Cape it is of outmost importance that we preserve the historic integrity of the area.



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Ms. Crocker shared her family's reasons for relocating and her concerns about the current political climate and the isolation of vulnerable groups. She suggested the need for a more proactive approach to community engagement, emphasizing the importance of in-person interaction. Ms. Crocker proposed that if appointed, the new member could bring a fresh perspective to the Human Service Committee and promote progressive programs.



Committee members welcomed Mr. Jones for joining today and asked Mr. Jones for a little background before they consider him for reappointment.

Mr. Robert Jones has been involved in local government, discussed their experiences and perspectives. Bob shared his insights on his 22-year tenure on the Steamship Authority, emphasizing the importance of a strong committee chairman and the value of community involvement. They also discussed the potential benefits and costs of running boats between New Bedford and Nantucket, the value of public input, and the historical significance of the Steamship Authority. Lastly, they touched on the decision-making process for appointing board members, addressed potential conflicts of interest, and discussed recent events.

Councilor Clark mentioned to him that the website isn't easy to locate the meeting Agendas and minutes for their meeting, and asked where the Public can access this information. Mr. Jones replied they are on the web page, but Mr. Jones will reach out to the Steamship Authority to clarify the meeting schedule and agendas for the Board of Governors and the Port Council and make it more visible for the Public.

Appointments Committee members welcomed Welmer "Junior de Oliveira who has applied to the Youth Commission, as a student member. Mr. de Oliveira attends Barnstable High School and is running for Class President. He is an entrepreneur who has started his own business and advertises on social media, does lots of yard work, and was here at the last meeting with his friend Noah who also applied. Has a passion of helping others and wants to be part of the Youth Commission so he can give a voice to the Youth, likes what they do and has attended meetings in the past and helped at the job fair, and the Youth Summit.

Members of the Committee thanked all the applicants that applied, and will hold on any votes tonight regarding recommendations. The Committee members decided to hold another meeting on April 03, 2024, to make recommendations for the vacancies that currently exist on our Boards/Committees and Commissions.
