RECREATION COMMISSION MINUTES

05 June 2017

The meeting was called to order at 5:30, all commissioners present introduced themselves. Motion made by Richard Sawyer to accept the minutes for May's meeting as submitted, Renee Dowling seconded. **VOTE – ALL IN FAVOR**

Soccer Resort Beach Blitz Presentation, Niall Swan – Patti Lloyd, CC Chamber of Commerce spoke on behalf of Niall Swan, an event holder from Texas. Patti Lloyd stated participants come from all over New England and as far as Toronto, approximately 60 teams, about 1,300 individuals. Ages of players range from eight years old to adults. Niall gets the information out mainly via social media, his website and soccer magazines. The event has gone from zero to sell out in three years. Patti Machado stated we need to make sure the rules and regulations are clear to all the participants. Parking is only an issue during the transitions of teams. Patti Machado stated the referee's need to know they must pay for parking at the beach. The event helps to showcase our beaches. It takes place Saturday, August 5th. Patti Machado requested a copy of Niall's insurance and financials.

Discussion followed. The survey will be on the Town's website; Renee Dowling suggested linking the survey to the School's websites, also concerns about turf safety and to keep lacrosse on the list for field usage. Commission expressed concerns with the ongoing tick situation. Richard Sawyer stressed that the field study be as comprehensive as possible, especially ongoing maintenance. Kevin Turner suggested using John Gleason regarding field use by the different user groups; hours of field use children vs adults; W&S stated all of that goes into their study. Get to the most users for the survey; Richard Sawyer mentioned pickball and hope the community comes out to express interest in this and other sports; turf fields are much safer than in the past but it is the cost and maintenance. Kevin Turner also asked if the beaches are being looked at as field use. W&S stated no, but a good suggestion. Patti Machado stated the beaches are already used for volleyball, soccer, wiffleball etc. they are used as fields already, they just aren't maintained the same way, beaches are simple. Richard Sawyer stated want to reemphasis that this is a very important report for us.

Bill Dado, Marstons Mills, stated I hope picklball is addressed. Disappointed not being addressed in the field study; about 155 people playing in Barnstable, fastest growing group. Bill stated thanks for reassuring me this will be added. Barry Paster, W Barnstable stated the fields are in disrepair, but with the "if you build it and they will come" idea how do you get there. Lynne Poyant stated Lombard field is a \$1.6 million project and has gone out to bid, it was recognized outside this field study because of the need to upgrade it. John Gleason has contacted past user groups who left because of the conditions of the fields and the hope is to bring them back with the "build it and the will come" vision. Richard Sawyer suggested looking at walking paths around the fields. Gene Bollinger stated we totally get how important this study is to the town and hope to bring back some great information.
