BACKGROUND: The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) would like to recommend that the town support the funding request of \$5,000.00 from the Barnstable Historical Commission and the Barnstable Old King's Highway Historic District Committee regarding the Nickerson Cottage Relocation on Sandy Neck. The project will be managed by the Sandy Neck Board.

RATIONALE: The land where the Nickerson Cottage is located is held for Open Space under a Conservation Restriction. The goal of this project is to move the cottage to a less ecologically sensitive site within the designated Sandy Neck Cultural Resources Area. The entire length of Sandy Neck and the buildings thereon are listed in the National Register as the "Sandy Neck Cultural Resources District." The project must to move forward during the winter of 2007.

FISCAL IMPACT: The total project is estimated to cost approximately \$15,000.00 to relocate the Nickerson Cottage and restore the abandoned site area. The \$5,000.00 request from the CPC funds will match a pledge of \$5,000.00 from The Nature Conservancy.

RATIONALE: The Adult Supportive Day Program offered by the Town of Barnstable through the Senior Center offers a vital link for local seniors and their care givers. Through the program, seniors, who either choose not to remain at home alone during the day or who may need additional care, are provided a safe, nurturing environment. For many caregivers or adult children who are caring for an aging parent, this respite allows them to continue to meet the necessary everyday tasks of working, caring for children or having a few free hours to run errands.

A nutritious lunch is provided each day as part of this program, and the grant from the Friends of the Old Schoolhouse allows the Senior Center to keep the cost of this lunch affordable.

Acceptance of this gift will allow the Senior Center to continue to provide this invaluable community service to elders and their caregivers at the lowest cost possible.

In recognition of their grant, the Friends of the Old School House will be appropriately mentioned in all publicity materials.

BACKGROUND: As a general matter in the bond market, blocks or lots of bonds maturing in the early years are charged lower rates of interest at the time of sale while those maturing in the later years are charged a higher rate of interest at the time of sale. As economic conditions change, so do interest rates. The Treasury is always alert to opportunities to refund (refinance) outstanding bonds to achieve future interest savings.

ANALYSIS: Authorization of this item will position the Town to act quickly to changing economic conditions that may result in interest savings on the Town's outstanding general obligations bonds dated 1999 through 2004. As with any other borrowing authorization, this refunding authorization will not be effective until 30 days after its final passage. The Town is actively researching this opportunity and is targeting February 2007 as the next potential refunding date.

FISCAL IMPACT: Impact will be favorable to future annual debt service. The issuance costs associated with any refunding will be factored into projected savings and are paid for from a premium charged to the buyer of these refunded bonds at the time of sale.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: The Town Manager recommends favorable action.
