Call To Order:

Chairman Griffin called the regular meeting of the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Commission to order at 4:030p.m. Attendance roll call was taken followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Finance Subcommittee (Commissioners Weill, Flores, and Bailey)

The Finance Subcommittee met on Tuesday, May 2, 2023. Commissioner Weill read a review of the meeting (attached).

<u>Infrastructure & Marketing Subcommittee (Commissioners Young, and Bierwirth)</u> The Infrastructure & Marketing subcommittee met on Tuesday, May 2, 2023. Commissioner Bierwirth read a review of the meeting (attached).

Old Business:

COM0423-1 Approval of the Lease Subordination, Non-Disturbance, Recognition, and Attornment Agreement by and through the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Commission and Whole Foods Market Group, INC., Sub-lessor of WS Development.

MOTION to approve the Lease Subordination, Non-Disturbance, Recognition, and Attornment Agreement by and between the Town of Barnstable, acting by and through the Cape Cod Gateway Airport Commission, and Whole Foods Market Group, INC., Sub-lessor of WS Development.

SPONSOR: Management (May be acted upon)



- This agenda item was moved and read by Commissioner Guiod, and seconded by Commissioner Weill.
- WS Development has finalized a lease with Whole Foods and now they are required to deliver a Recognition Agreement to Whole Foods from the Airport Commission.
- WS Development and Whole Foods negotiated some of the terms that differ from the form of Recognition Agreement initially approved by the Commission in 2018.
- A redline version of the agreement was offered by Whole Foods and it highlighted the changes to the original form that was attached to the Ground Lease that was approved by the Commission in 2018.
- Whole Foods was concerned with the casualty / eminent domain provisions; and with the
 incredibly unlikely event that the Ground Lease would terminate due to casualty or
 eminent domain taking by the FAA. This is a different approach then the form
 Recognition Agreement but not unusual for a tenant like Whole Foods.
- The Airport's attorneys from Anderson & Kreiger worked through the issues on behalf of the Airport and noted the following:
 - Termination for casualty and condemnation should remain.
 - If there was a complete taking, again very unlikely, the Ground Lease would automatically terminate under 10.2.
 - If there was a substantial taking or casualty, then WS Development, as the Tenant, has the right to terminate under Section 9.3(a), so termination is within WS Development control, not the Airport's.
- Modifications were made that satisfied both parties.
- This agenda item was unanimously approved by verbal vote.

New Business:

COM0523-1 Approval of the Lease Agreement by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Hyannis Hangar LLC.

MOTION to approve the 20 year lease agreement by and between the Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Hyannis Hangar LLC effective June 1, 2023 for 36,840 square feet of land for the purpose of constructing an Aircraft Storage facility with a stepped annual payment during the construction phase, and CPI increases for the remainder of the lease. SPONSOR: Finance Subcommittee (May be acted upon)

- This agenda item was moved and read by Commissioner Weill, and seconded by Commissioner Flores.
- Commissioner Weill recused himself from voting on this matter as he is one of the 28 members of the Cape Cod Aero Club that leases a hangar bay from Hyannis Hangar LLC.
- Management completed the Lease Agreement for land lease for Hyannis Hangar LLC
- The Lease Agreement was updated to include new language drafted by the Airport's attorneys
 - Similar language was used for agreements most recently developed for other hangar owners leasing land from the Airport
- During negotiations with the LESSEE, Capital Investments that included the removal and decommissioning of the septic system that services this building and connecting it to the newly expanded wastewater infrastructure were made by the airport and will be paid as part of additional rent by the LESSEE (LESSEE is the responsible party for decommissioning and connection fees).
 - The total cost of the Capital Investment at 180 Mary Dunn Way will be amortized by LESSEE based upon the capital cost of \$61,800, or \$257.50 per month over a period of twenty (20) years.



- Initial negotiations called for a 5 year and 10 year option for payment to the LESSOR by the LESSEE; however, during negotiations it was identified that the cost to recoup such fees in that shorter timespan would significantly increase subtenant hangar rental fees by 50% or more.
- This would go against Business Plan Goals, Goal A: maximize general aviation activity at the Airport as increasing the fee so sharply may cause renters to look elsewhere for storage
- Therefore, the Airport agreed to a 20-year Capital Investment payback
- Language was added to include full repayment of the capital investment in the event of early termination
- Term is for 20-years
 - Originally, no option renewals were added
 - Tenant asked for an option that has been afforded to other similar tenants:
 - Subject to LESSEE obtaining approval from the Barnstable Town Council
 pursuant to M.G.L. c. 90, §51 for a lease term in excess of 20 years, LESSEE shall
 have the option to renew this Lease for three (3) successive terms of five (5)
 years each (the "Renewal Terms"), on the same terms and conditions as this
 Lease, except that Rent for the Renewal Terms shall be the then Fair Market
 Rental Value for the Leased Premises as reasonably determined by the
 LESSOR. If the Barnstable Town Council does not approve extension of the
 Lease Term beyond 20 years, the Renewal Terms shall be void.

- A 3% of gross revenue payment to the Airport was also added to the lease
- This agenda item was approved by verbal vote. Commissioner Weill abstained.

Chairman Griffin asked the public to introduce themselves

This was taken out of order: Updates:

- Monthly Finance Review
 - Manager Servis reviewed the attached FY2023 Budget Update as of April 21, 2023. She reviewed the FY2022 to FY2023 comparisons of Jet Fuel sales, Rental Car Concessions, Passenger activity, Airport Operations, and the status of all of the Federal Grants.
 - Commissioner Flores commented that the Commission needs to be mindful
 of the finances and revenue stream diversity once all of the government
 grant programs are taken away.
 - He also commented that the public needs to know that the extensive amount of money that the Federal Government has invested in this airport would all need to be paid back if this airport should cease to exist.
 - Commissioner Guiod stated that the primary focus needs to be aircraft operations.
 - Commissioner Flores commented that the cost of the ferries and buses compared to the cost of flights was prohibitive to getting more passengers.

COM0523-2 Approval of the Lease Amendment #8 by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Ross Rectrix HYA, LLC, dba Atlantic Aviation.

MOTION to approve Lease Amendment #8 by and between Cape Cod Gateway Airport and Ross Rectrix HYA, LLC, dba Atlantic Aviation effective June 1, 2023 for 7,500 square feet of land for the purpose of vehicle parking for clients and employees. **SPONSOR:** Finance Subcommittee **(May be acted upon)**

- This agenda item was moved and read by Commissioner Flores, and seconded by Commissioner Bailey.
- Management completed the Lease Amendment #8 for land lease for Ross Rectrix HYA, LLC, dba Atlantic Aviation
- The Amendment is for additional vehicle parking for clients and staff at the Atlantic location at 730 Barnstable Road
- The amendment is tied to the expiration of their existing lease (February 2024 expiration) and all the terms thereof
- A survey of the leased area was by Horsley Witten Group "Lease Plan Vehicle Parking Parcel H, Exhibit G, Cape Cod Gateway Airport, Barnstable, Massachusetts" and will incorporate 7,500 square feet
- The additional rent = Four Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$4,125.00), payable monthly in advance in payments of Three Hundred Forty-Three Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents (\$343.75)
- This agenda item was unanimously approved by verbal vote.

Continuation of the Updates:

- o Monthly Business Plan Review
 - o Manager Servis reviewed the four Business Plan Goals and the new highlighted information on the Business Plan Update as of 4/27/2023 (attached).



- Development of a new Business Plan will be discussed at a strategic planning workshop once the Communications Management team is on board.
- Commissioner Guiod offered his services to proceed with the charrette as he has done
 this for other entities, the Airport will not need to hire anyone to do this. Commissioner
 Guiod volunteered to run the workshop to be discussed and dates identified for at
 least four future meetings
- Manager Servis reviewed the scout events, future events, media promotions, land lease and hangar development, on-going projects, airport interns, media, and marketing and outreach.
- Gull Air was an entity that was previously at the Airport and it has been resurrected as a charter service. Bill McGrath is seeking to get FAA Certification to provide Air Carrier service through the terminal.
- A discussion of other target airlines for service was discussed. The addition of an airline consultant will help with streamlining this focus. Southern Airway Express is still in communications with the airport for future service.
- o The Eventbrite link is available for anyone to sign up for the June "Festivities on the Flight Line" event. Local Jazz musician was procured by Sue Kennedy for the event and Ethan Allen will be providing furniture staging.
- Additional events during the summer are not feasible due to construction and staff workload.
- Land Lease and Hangar development, the seasonal paid internship for project management, diversifying revenue streams were discussed.
- Aloft Aviation, Eric Drugge, is working out of a temporary building to provide flight instruction during the summer while his building is constructed. There were two bids received for the Communications Managers Position. Interviews will be held. Media outreach has progresses with the local Chambers and press releases are being released for ongoing airport projects and events. Cape Cod Broadcasting has been conducting digital marketing outreach to areas that are popular with JetBlue passengers.

Electric Aviation Update

- Smart Program Memo & Update the Airport is looking into a solar installation for the rapid recharge unit for Electric Aviation through the Smart Grid Program.
- The Airport is also working on a lease with BETA to install a charging statin on the East Ramp.

- Chairman Griffin commented that the Airport has two positions that have been difficult to fill. He does not understand why there is a pilot shortage. There used to be tremendous number of good, well trained pilots from the military. This is not occurring anymore. There is no one answer.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

IN1021-2 Review and Discuss the Sign Plan Modifications to Meet Rebranding Efforts

- Airport Management requested quotes for the replacement of the wooden sign at the rotary from three Cape Cod companies. Two of the companies said they could not provide a quote due to the construction involved with the installation.
- The Town of Barnstable procurement requested that this be put out to bid so as to receive a greater response.
- The rotary sign replacement will be in FY2023, and the Tower signage and the Attucks Lane sign will be replaced in FY2024.
- Manager Servis reached out to Mass Dot Aeronautics concerning the replacement of the directional signs on the highway. They
 currently do not have the capacity to complete these, so she will need to reach out to District 5 to get these replaced. There are
 only 2 signs that need the name replacement to Cape Cod Gateway Airport.

- A quarterly public newsletter is under development to control the Airport's narrative. Management provided feedback from the draft review and it will be shared with the Commission once finalized.

Airport Commission Presentation FY2023 Budget Update As of April 21, 2023



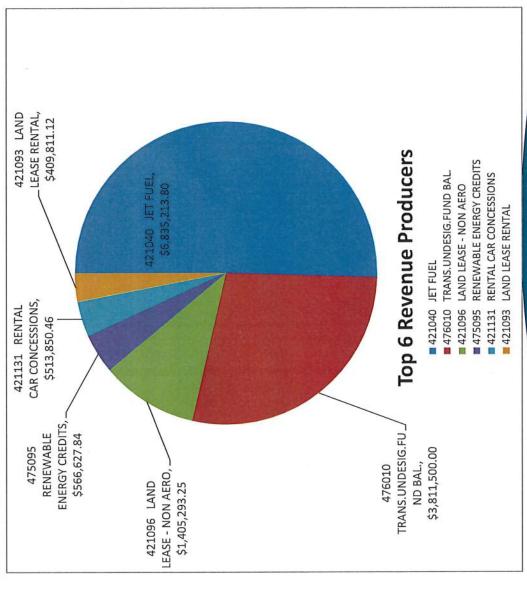

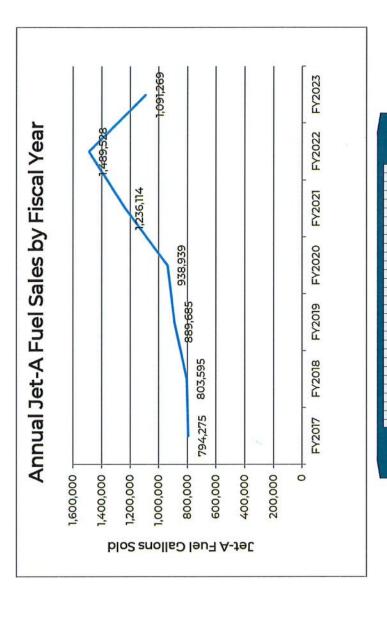

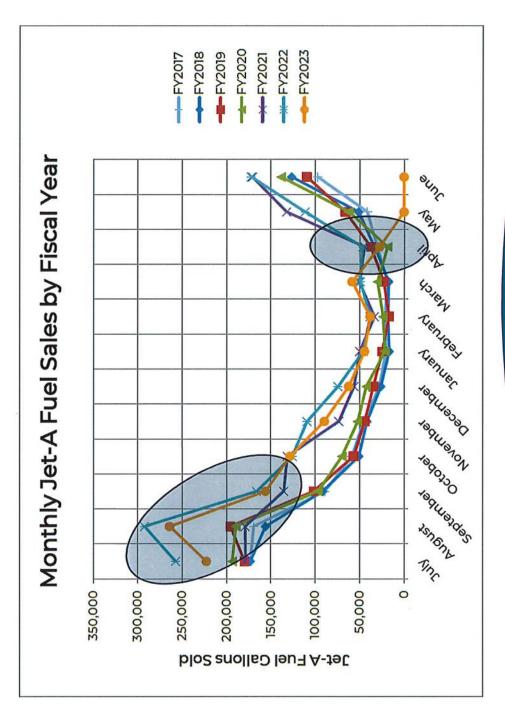

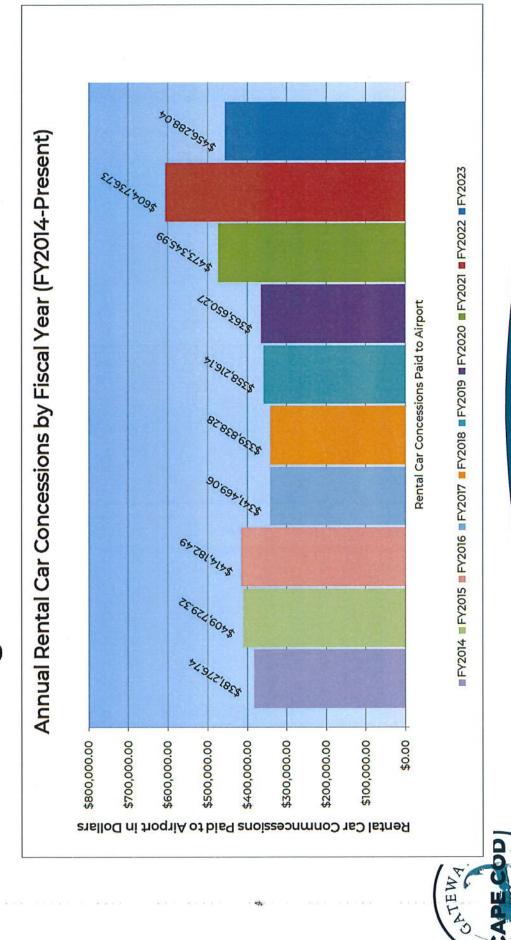

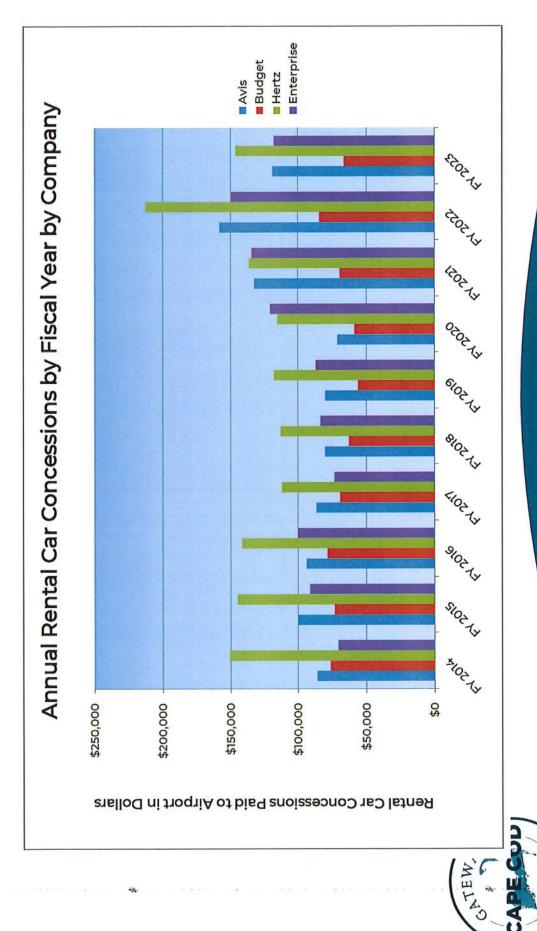

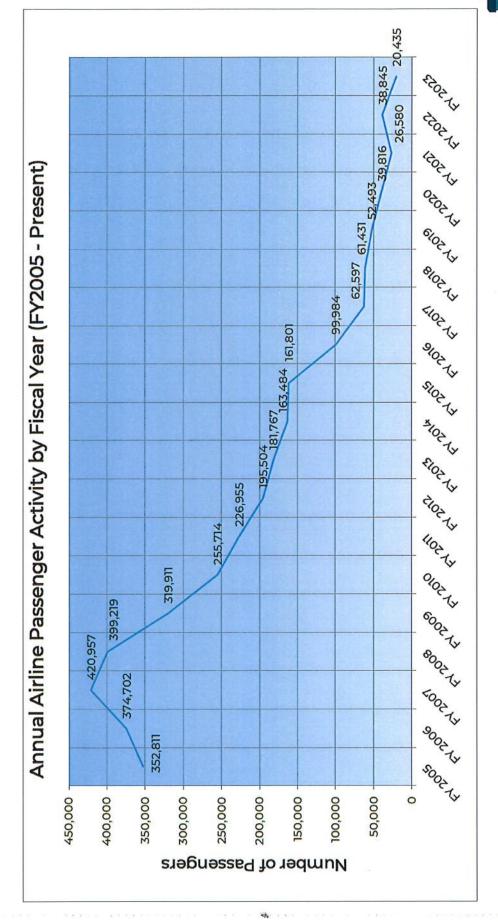

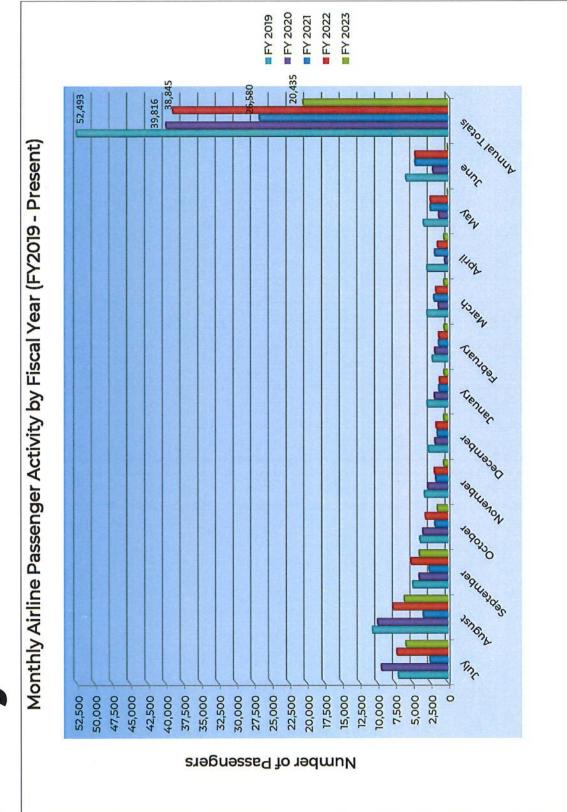


FY2023 Airport Operations/Passenger Activity
