Mr. Gary Markowitz represented himself.

- It was clarified by the Chair the 12" rule is not an interpretation by the Administrator it is defined by Commission.
- There was a discussion on what is the true depth measurements at the pier could it actually be changed in the order of conditions.
- Could the request for a vessel change be considered as an actual waiver request.
- Concern raised regarding vessels traveling with engines down in shallow water. It does stir sediments up, nitrogen especially. Rich zone of nutrients.
- If the Commission did adopt a variance/waiver in this case, how could they be reassured that others would follow the idea of tilting engine.
- If the Commission adopts a waiver in this case and then doesn't apply it in other cases then they could be considered arbitrary and capricious.
- The 12" rule was based on studies, with a desire to have a rule that was a standard, objective, and enforceable.
- Commissioners stressed the 12" rule must be applied.
- Mr. Markowitz stated he currently owns the vessel is currently berthed at the pier. Waiting for delivery of dingy.
- Administrator stated the vessel was not to be berthed at pier. This was discussed with Mr. Markowitz prior to hearing.

Motion to deny the revised plan request to change vessel. Also recognize depth on plan and place in order of conditions. Additional discussion took place on request for depth measurement change.
