Reminder of Commission's Purpose and Proper Procedure

Chair Cheryl Powell reads into record:

§112-24 – Purpose. The purpose of this article is to promote the educational, cultural, economic and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Town of Barnstable, and the Town's unique community character, through the preservation and protection of the distinctive characteristics of buildings, structures, and places significant in the history and architecture of Barnstable, and through the preservation, maintenance and improvement of appropriate settings for such buildings, structures, and places, and the encouragement of new design which is compatible with the existing historical and community character, and through the benefits resulting to the economy of said Town by preserving and enhancing the amenities and historical aspects of the various villages and areas which make Barnstable a desirable place to live and for tourists to visit.

### **New Business**

<u>Certificate of Appropriateness</u> <u>Chris M. Solimini – 606 Main St., Hyannis – Map 308 Parcel 066</u> Paint and Siding

Noel Sestor in attendance, for the Applicant.

Chair Cheryl Powell reads the applicant's detailed description into record, application packet, pg. 3, Exhibit A. I would like to change the color of trim in front to white. Also would like to vinyl side the side of building but not the first 30 ft. of wall, it will stay the same.

Betsy Young asks for clarification of where the building is, reference to picture, Exhibit A.

Taryn Thoman asks for clarification of the area re the three store fronts.

David Dumont asks about the side of the bldg, that would be proposed for vinyl siding.

Discussion regarding approval of vinyl.

Paul Wackrow clarifies the District's Guidelines, see Hyannis Main St. Waterfront Historic District Guidelines for Exterior Building Mateirals and Colors - bullet no. 6, refers to vinyl siding, Exhibit C. He could not find an example of vinyl ever being approved.

Noel Sestor replies that this area rots, the wood stays wet so the Applicant was thinking about vinyl for this reason.

Chair Cheryl Powell explains that Commission doesn't allow this.

Betsy Young confirms from the handout what is allowed. Trim to be white, color chart referred to, Exhibit B. Any other damage to the bldg. to be repaired.

Dave Dumont would like to have the Applicant here to go over everything.

Options – continuance or approve what is on the application.

Chair Cheryl Powell confirms – cedar shake shingles. White will be the color for the trim. No shutters on this application,

Noel Sestor confirms Applicant will do white trim, can he do corner boards metal and paint white?

Chair Cheryl Powell and David Dumont - No, not allowed.

Noel Sestor confirms Applicant will keep the shutters the same color. Do repairs in stages. Replace corners with wood.

David Dumont explains aluminum and wood mateirals, Azek is an approved material, this won't rot and this may be a good recommendation for this.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion to make findings, as modified, wood or Azek material, white paint for trim, shutters not in application, corners to be Azek, moved by Betsy Young, to be compatible with preservation and protection of the district as modified, seconded by Cecelia Carey, Jonathan Kanter abstains. The motion passes.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for a Certificate of Appropriateness, moved by David Dumont for 606 Main Street, Hyannis, with conditions that trim be approved to be wood or Azek material, color to be white, reside/gable end approve cedar shingles, white or natural, seconded by Taryn Thoman, Jonathan Kanter abstains. The motion passes.

Hyannis Harbor Tours Inc. – 220 Ocean St., Hyannis – Map 326 Parcel 070 Windows, Doors, Alterations

Chair Cheryl Powell asks for a brief pause in the meeting. Marina Atsalis leaves the meeting/recusal needed – <u>possible</u> recusal to be discussed as Commissioner is an abutter. this Commission Member is an abutter for the next two applications on the Agenda.

Tim Sawyer in attendance. He gives an explanation of the project, refers to the picture of the Bldg. 220 Ocean Street, Exhibit D. He refers to the rendering/Exhibit D/outline of the bldg. Taking existing windows out and putting new windows double hung in. New entry vestibule, aluminum entry door. No increase to the footprint of the bldg., 3 sliding windows now at Ben & Jerry's, one window will be eliminated and two sliding windows put in.

Betsy young confirms that this is the location for tickets.

Tim Sawyer clarifies that the ticket sales will be inside now, a larger waiting space will be on the inside.

David Dumont asks about materials.

Tim Sawyer replies, Anderson A series, fiber ex material white, will match existing. Third window coming out.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion, moved by David Dumont that the Commission find that it be compatible with preservation and protection of the district, seconded by Taryn Thoman, so voted unanimously.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for Certificate of Appropriateness, moved by Betsy Young, to approve as described, seconded by Cecelia Carey, so voted unanimously.

Hyannis Harbor Tours Inc. – 230 Ocean St., Hyannis – Map 326 Parcel 069 Windows, Alterations

Tim Sawyer in attendance. This bldg. is directly next door to 220 Ocean St., he refers to rendering of bldg. Exhibit D, layout/plan A2.0, there are 3 entry points and a vestibule. Eliminating doors on the octagon piece, replacing with windows like other location on this portion of the bldg., awnings above head level of windows.

Back view, back side of building, adding a chimney to enclose kitchen exhaust hood. A2.1 plan referenced, Exhibit E, this is Channel Point Rd. view, refers to picture of building, corner photo, Exhibit F. This portion did not have the exhaust. Also putting a window into the kitchen.

David Dumont clarifies materials and woven shingle corner.

Chair Cheryl Powell asks for public comment. None. Public comment is closed.

Taryn Thoman asks about the chimney on this application, asks where this will be.

Tim Sawyer points out both views form the plans A2.1 and A2.0, Exhibits D and E, confirms never been a chimney there before. This is not a brick chimney, exhaust hood enclosure. Points it out on the rendering and confirms putting a window in to. Cedar shingle material.

Chair Cheryl Powell points out the roof line. Cedar shakes?

Tim Sawyer replies, yes, matching same product.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion on the findings, moved by Taryn Thoman to be compatible with the preservation and protection of the district, seconded by Jonathan Kanter, so voted unanimously.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for Certificate of Appropriateness, moved by Betsy Young to issue for 230 Ocean St., as described in the submitted materials, seconded by Cecelia Carey, so vote unanimously.

One of these matters, 252 Main Street will be submitting and application and come to HHDC, most likely in September.
