Keep children away from algae in the water or on the shore.




Do not drink this water or use it for cooking.







Barnstable County and Tetra Tech are looking for volunteers to collect and submit samples of their private well water for water quality testing at no cost to you, a value of over \$400. In conjunction with the Barnstable County Department of Health and Environment, the collected samples will be tested for a variety of pollutants, including emerging contaminants like PFAS.



Through the Center for Coastal Studies in Provincetown, Vania Rivera Leon will talk to us about Humpback whales. They are commonly sighted in the Gulf of Maine particularly in the waters of Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary, a rich feeding area that attracts a large number of whales, especially during the warmer months. 


