Barnstable Local Comprehensive Plan

Community Vision, Goals, and Strategic Actions

The Town of Barnstable is updating its Local Comprehensive Plan, a process to set out a future vision for land use and development, infrastructure and resource protection.

A Local Comprehensive Planning Committee (LCPC) will be established to steer the development of the plan and the process. The Town is currently working to establish this committee, consistent with the process and framework defined within the <u>Final Local Comprehensive Plan Committee Memorandum</u>.

Interviews with applicants for the LCPC will be held on Monday, April 4th in three time blocks: 7:00 am to 9:30 am | 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm | 4:30 pm – 6:45 pm These times may be subject to minor adjustment. The interviews will be held via Zoom and will be open to the public to view. Zoom links will be posted on the <u>Town calendar</u> and <u>Barnstable Local Comprehensive Plan website</u>.

In response to the robust interest in participation on the Local Comprehensive Planning Committee, those who applied for the LCPC will be invited to participate on an LCP Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee will be convened regularly and/or at key stages in the process to provide feedback and suggestions to the Local Comprehensive Planning Committee about process and products. Household hazardous waste (HHW) collections protect our local drinking water. Most chemicals are too toxic to throw away in regular trash or dump down the drain, so collections for residents are being held to take that waste off your hands and keep it out of our water supply.

We define Residents as people who own a home, own a second home, are tenants, or landlords in the town. Proof of residency includes one of the following: Drivers License with in-town address or tax bill.

Not a Resident or Sticker Holder? You can still participate for a fee.

Going on now through through March, from 7:00AM to 5:00 PM, West Main Street will be closed from Strawberry Hill Road to Pleasant Park Avenue as shown in Figure 1 below. In addition, Strawberry Hill Road from Pine Street to Craigville Beach Road and Craigville Beach Road from Lake Elizabeth Drive to Centerville Avenue will remain closed during the same timeframe. The closures are necessary due to work associated with the gravity sewer main installation work. Formal road closure and detour will be in place, with resident and business access only.
