





CAPE COD TRANSIT NEEDS ASSESSMENT

The Cape Cod Commission is conducting a two-year study to assess the region's transit needs, with the goal of gathering public input to improve the transportation system. During the first year, the study will focus on engaging the public, strengthening partnerships with stakeholders, and reviewing existing conditions as well as previous studies and projects. This work will contribute to a final report in the second year of the study, which will provide recommendations and feedback to the Cape Cod Regional Transit Authority (CCRTA) to inform their new Regional Transit Plan.



Work will occur Monday through Friday, from approximately 7:00AM to 4:00PM and is anticipated to be contained within the playground site and adjacent Centerville Recreation Building parking lot. Completion is anticipated by early Spring 2026.

Throughout construction, access to the Centerville Recreation Building facilities will be limited with the back parking lot closed to the public.



DISABILITY COMMISSION SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABILITY

The Barnstable Disability Commission awards \$2,000 scholarships each year to up to six people annually. Students awarded a scholarship must reside in Barnstable and have a documented disability or be planning to study in a field related to disabilities. This year, scholarships were awarded to these schools: Barnstable High School, Sturgis Charter Public School, and Cape Cod Community College's Project Forward Program.

The Barnstable Disability Commission advises and guides the Town of Barnstable and the general public regarding issues of accessibility in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Massachusetts Architectural Access Board. In addition, the Barnstable Disability Commission provides information and referral services to residents.


