

CAPE COD HOLIDAY LIGHTS RECYCLING COLLECTION

All 15 towns are accepting broken holiday strand lights to be recycled!

Holiday lights that can be accepted: Rope lights Garland lights C7 and C9 bulbs Mini lights LED holiday lights



Recycle Broken or Unwanted Holiday Lights at all Transfer Stations across Cape Cod Drop off lights for free during the collection drive, running from December to the end of January. Barnstable County's Cape Cod Cooperative Extension and AmeriCorps Cape Cod are partnering with all 15 Cape towns to recycle your holiday strand lights for free. Residents can bring in old or non-working holiday lights to be properly recycled at designated holiday lights collection bins found at each transfer station, from this December until the end of January, 2024. Lights will be stripped down and as much material as possible will be recycled.

"This time of the year, countless strands of holiday lights are thrown away because a single bulb goes out or breaks," said Kari Parcell, Cape Cod Cooperative Extension's Municipal Assistance Coordinator. "With this free collection drive, Barnstable County can divert all holiday lights from the landfill, as recycled goods. This helps save the environment by reducing the amount of waste entering our landfills." Lights attached to trees cannot be accepted. Other light fixtures, such as lighted angels, stars, or other lighted items cannot be accepted. Holiday lights that are accepted:

- Rope lights
- Garland lights
- C7 and C9 bulbs
- Mini lights
- LED holiday lights
