#### Town Council - Moment of Silence

Town Councilor Jeff Mendes offered condolences to Mrs. Reed for the passing of Mr. (John) Reed. As a former student, he would always be Mr. Reed to Councilor Mendes. Many people know Mr. Reed as the head of the NAACP, but he was actually a long time school teacher at Barnstable High School (he began his career in Barnstable on May 21, 1973 where he was employed by the School Department until February 1, 2016. The last 7 years were in a part-time capacity.) Councilor Mendes said that Mr. Reed probably had more impact on kids in this town than any other teacher.

He founded the first multicultural club on the Cape – known as the Imani Club. He was very fair, a pillar of the community, a social justice warrior, and we will all miss him immensely.

Town Councilor Gordon Starr offered a moment for one of the hearts and souls of Barnstable Village – James Otis Ellis, Sr. who recently passed. Mr. Ellis was an 11th generation Cape Codder who carried on his family's 111 year tradition of blacksmithing – the longest record in the country.

Mr. Ellis had many honors bestowed upon him including as founder of the Barnstable County Fair Blacksmith Exhibit, was the Grand Marshall of the 2015 Barnstable Village 4th of July parade (alongside his wife Joan), received the Town of Barnstable Historic Preservation Award in 2021, and was a member of the New England Blacksmith Association.





# 2023 TOWN OF BARNSTABLE SNOW & ICE

#### How can you help?

#### Please stake your property

One of the important things you can do to help our plow drivers is stake the edge of your properties with plow stakes/reflectors.

- Plow stakes can be wood or fiberglass with reflectors on top or wrapped around the body of the stake. The reflective material needs to be high enough up the stake that it can be seen over the snow drift.
- The stakes should be driven into the ground as close to the edge of the property as possible.
   Generally we recommend placing them every 8-10 feet.
- Installing stakes is easier before the ground freezes, it is recommended you do it sooner rather than later.

## Please follow the advice of public safety officials

When a driving ban is put into effect, it is for your protection. Please stay off the roads until given the all clear notice.

- Make certain your vehicle is ready for winter driving.
- Reduce your speed. This is the number one cause of winter accidents.
- Please give plows and sanders the right of way and stay at least 50 feet back from each.


