
# ROAD CLOSURES

# Superintendent Dr. Sara Ahern's March Newsletter to Families and the Community



#### **Entry Plan**

I recently shared my Entry Plan Findings with the School Committee at their February 1 meeting. After gathering multiple data points across the District through listening sessions, review of documents and data, and observations, I identified the following strengths and opportunities:

#### **Strengths**

- 1. Diversity of our students and families
- 2. Dedication of our faculty and staff
- 3. Breadth of opportunities and community
- 4. partnerships afforded to Barnstable students

#### **Opportunities**

- 1. A strong desire and need to come together
- 2. Continued focus on academics and social-emotional learning
- 3. A need for creative measures in developing talent
- 4. Facilities, enrollment, and future planning

#### A Note about Student Behavior

Barnstable, like all schools and districts everywhere, are experiencing an increased level of dysregulation among students and lagging social skills including but not limited to conflict resolution. I want to acknowledge that safe behavior within our school buildings is paramount and we take both proactive and responsive measures to ensure that.

Predictable rules, communication of our expected behaviors, and consequences outlined in our code of conduct (student handbooks) are one approach. Predictable routines such as expectations for being in class and out of the hallways, and the wearing of ID badges is another measure to ensure order on our campuses. We also work on school cultures, the development of supportive relationships, and using opportunities to teach pro-social skills.

As your Superintendent, I want you to know that I am committed to this and work closely alongside your building administrators. While responding to student behavior is inherent in the work of school leaders, school leaders can not accomplish this alone. Building our school cultures need to be a collective effort involving faculty and staff, students, and families as well. I look forward to our continued partnership.

#### FY 24 Budget Presentation to the School Committee - March 1, 2023

New Deputy Director for School Finance, Chris Dwelley, and I made a FY 24 Budget Presentation to the School Committee on Wednesday, March 1. This follows an initial presentation on February 1 and a budget workshop on February 15.

The budget at this time is proposed to be \$81,056,122 or an increase of \$4,287,154, which is 5.57%. Major budget drivers include contractual obligations, increased cost of gasoline, and the pressure of inflation. Budget enhancements are prioritized around providing equity across K-3 schools, classroom instruction and interventions, facilities planning, and talent development.

The Governor's budget is delayed this year due to the leadership transition. As the District is expecting additional Student Opportunity Act funding in the Governor's budget, we anticipate being able to add additional budget enhancements in order to close opportunity gaps. Updates will occur regularly through budget presentations and the budget hearing at the School Committee meetings this March and April.


