Human Case of West Nile Virus Confirmed in Town of Barnstable

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) announced today a human case of West Nile virus (WNV) in the Town of Barnstable. This raises the risk level to high in our town.

By taking a few, common sense precautions, people can help to protect themselves and their loved ones:



Apply Insect Repellent

Use a repellent with DEET, permethrin, picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus



Clothing Can Help Reduce Mosquito Bites

Although it may be difficult to do when it's hot, wearing long-sleeves, long pants and socks when outdoors will help keep mosquitoes away from your skin.



Be Aware of Peak Mosquito Hours

The hours from dusk to dawn are peak biting times for many mosquitoes.

CoastSweep 2024 SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 15TH, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM

Sponsored by the Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone Management and coordinated by the Urban Harbors Institute, thousands of COASTSWEEP volunteers remove debris that would otherwise pollute our oceans, beaches, lakes, and rivers. Participants collect bag after bag of trash and debris, and record their findings onto data cards. The data is sent to the Ocean Conservancy and entered into a massive marine debris database. This information is then analyzed and used to identify the sources of marine debris, which helps to prevent the problem in the future.



ABOUT CHRIS HERREN

Chris Herren, a basketball legend from Fall River, Massachusetts, was an All-American, broke scoring records and was recruited by the nation's top colleges. Herren realized his lifetong dream of playing in the NBA when he was drafted by the Denver Nuggets in 1990 and then traded to his hometown team; the Boston Celitics, before losing his cereer and almost his family to the disease of addiction.

In long term recovery since 2008, Chris inspires people to start the conversation on wellness and educate themselves on the disease of addiction. It is his hope that strength will be found in the struggle and communities will come TOGETHER to address the issue of substance use disorder, addressed for effective treatment and embrace the power of recovery.


