


Mock disaster event planned for September 28 calls for heavy public safety presence. Cape Cod Gateway Airport will conduct an in-depth exercise involving safety protocols via a full-scale emergency drill on Tuesday, September 28 at 5:00 p.m. at the airport grounds in Hyannis. The exercise will simulate a completely mock scenario of an aircraft accident. Actual aircraft will not be used in the drill, yet fire departments will be setting training fires and using other simulations to test the airport's emergency response plan. Police, Fire, Cape Cod and Falmouth hospitals, US Coast Guard, Federal Aviation Administration, Massachusetts Department of Transportation-Aeronautics Division, Airlines, American Red Cross, Emergency Management, and other Cape Cod towns will all play a role in the exercise.

MUNICIPAL MATTERS

The latest episode of Municipal Matters, a new Channel 18 production, takes a deep dive into Conservation and the Community Preservation Committee, to help residents and visitors develop a broader understanding of the facets of protecting open space and its relation to the conservation of land, water, community and history.

We hold WEEKLY vaccine clinics at the Harborside Conference Room in the Barnstable County Complex (Barnstable Village) every Thursday from 10am to 2pm. We have Pfizer (12+), Moderna (18+) and Johnson & Johnson (18+) vaccines available. Insurance is not required.



Free COVID-19 PCR testing is now available at **two** convenient locations:

- Barnstable County Fairgrounds in Falmouth, Thursdays and Sundays WEEKLY from 4pm to 6pm.
- Eastham Police Department on Route 6 in Eastham, Tuesdays WEEKLY from 2pm to 4pm.

MassNotify



Know if and when you were exposed to COVID-19!

Cape Cod welcomes visitors from all over the world, which is why it's more important than ever to track COVID-19 exposures and spread. MassNotify is an important tool to help you do just that. It's not an application that you buy through the app store - it's a simple adjustment to the settings on your phone. And it's completely private and anonymous! The service is strictly to make you aware of a potential exposure so that you can take the appropriate precautions.

On an iPhone:

- Go to Settings
- Scroll down to Exposure Notifications
- Click "Turn on Exposure Notifications"
- Click "Continue"
- Select United States, then select Massachusetts
- Follow the instructions on the following screens to enable MassNotify
- Note that Bluetooth must be turned on for MassNotify to detect other users nearby.

On an Android phone:

- Go to Settings
- Click "Google"
- Click "COVID-19 Exposure Notifications"
- Tap "Select your region"
- Select United States, then select Massachusetts
- Click "Continue" and follow the instructions on the following screens to enable MassNotify
- Note that Bluetooth must be turned on for MassNotify to detect other users nearby.

Drive-through community testing

COVID-19 testing is available by appointment at two convenient drive-through testing sites on our hospital campuses. Drive through community testing is available to everyone, whether experiencing symptoms or not.

The testing method utilized is an RT-PCR test, considered the gold standard for accurately detecting active COVID-19 virus in a collected specimen and is accepted by all governments and agencies.

Test results are currently available within 24 hrs.

Be Proactive Against Mosquitos in Your Backyard



Establish good mosquito avoidance habits now:

- Teach children to be aware of mosquito activity around them and avoid it
- Pick a repellent with an EPA-approved active ingredient
- Use long sleeves to cover up when possible
- Remove standing water to help reduce mosquito populations
- Repair screens

Avoid mosquito bites by using EPA approved repellents, appropriate clothing and avoiding peak mosquito activity between dusk and dawn. Remove standing water by emptying containers and tarps.

It's important to note the date changes to when a LIFEJACKET MUST BE WORN

Wearing a properly fitted life jacket (personal flotation device) could save your life. Most boating fatality victims were not wearing a life jacket. In Massachusetts, life jackets must be worn by:

- Canoeists and kayakers from September 15 - May 15 (including waterfowl hunters)
- Youth under 12 years old
- Personal watercraft users
- Waterskiers

WEAR A LIFE JACKET

It is recommended that you wear a life jacket every time you are on the water.

Accidents on the water often happen too quickly to reach and put on a stowed life jacket.

COVELL'S BEACH



KEATING, CYR JOIN OFFICIALS IN MARKING BARNSTABLE'S CLEAN WATER MILESTONE






On Friday, September 17th, Town of Barnstable, joined by Congressman William Keating, Sen.


