LAPC'S MISSION

The Town Council created the Land Acquisition Preservation & Committee (LAPC) in 2005. This Committee meets monthly and is charged recommending with parcels of land for acquisition to the **Community Preservation Committee** (CPC); leveraging in conjunction with the Town Manager and the Town Council, funding other than Community Preservation Act funding, for purchase of land, reviewing conservation restrictions Council before Town approval, the Open Space and keeping Recreation Plan and open space section of the Comprehensive Plan updated current, and and implementing the approved Cape Cod Pathways Plan. Additionally, a member of the Land Acquisition and Preservation Committee serves as the Town's representative on the Santuit Management Committee. LAPC assists Town departments in the management of the Land Bank lands acquired under the Land Bank Act and its provisions.


