

The Town Council created the Open Space Committee (formerly the Land Acquisition & Preservation Committee) in 2005. This Committee meets monthly and is charged with recommending parcels of land for acquisition to the Community Preservation Committee (CPC); leveraging in conjunction with the Town Manager and the Town Council, funding other than Community Preservation Act funding, for purchase of land, reviewing conservation restrictions before Town Council approval, keeping the Open Space and Recreation Plan and open space section of the Comprehensive Plan updated and current, and

implementing the approved Cape Cod
Pathways Plan. Additionally, a member of
the Land Acquisition and Preservation
Committee serves as the Town's
representative on the Santuit
Management Committee. OSC assists
Town departments in the management of
the Land Bank lands acquired under the
Land Bank Act and its provisions.

Barnstable Village Loop

Beginning time: 10 AM

Approx. length/time to complete: 1.5-2 hrs Starting point: Barnstable Superior Court Building Rating of terrain and pace: Moderate with some hills Directions: Rte. 6A to Barnstable Village. Meet in front of the courthouse at 3195 Main St. Parking is available in the lots behind the courthouse.

Maximum Effort with TheDeadPoolians at Hyannis Ponds Wildlife Area
